MADD Canada identifies policies, laws and administrative sanctions that will reduce the number of Canadians being killed and injured in impaired driving crashes every year. MADD Canada promotes these policies to elected officials and decision makers at both the Federal and Provincial/

At the Federal level, MADD Canada communicated with elected officials to promote the need for: improved testing measures for drug-impaired drivers, particularly since the legalization of cannabis; mandatory alcohol screening; and improved sentencing for the most serious impaired driving offences.

At the Provincial/Territorial level, MADD Canada communicated with leaders and decision makers in various jurisdictions to promote the need for: .00% BAC restrictions for young drivers until age 21; immediate roadside licence suspensions and vehicle impoundments for drivers in the .05% to .08% BAC range; mandatory alcohol interlocks for drivers convicted of impaired driving offences; administrative sanctions for drug-impaired drivers; and other measures to reduce and prevent impaired driving.
